New Menus Featured At Terlingua Lodge

New menus, featuring a wider selection and the addition of a la carte side orders, have been announced for the Terlingua Ranch Lodge Restaurant, according to Bill McNair, Terramar director of food and lodging.

Another improvement will be the availability of beer at the restaurant. Application has been made for the required license, and it is expected that beer will be for sale at the Lodge this summer.

In addition to four regular breakfasts, ranging in price from 60 cents to \$1.40, there will also be a complete selection of side orders — eggs, pancakes, ham, sausage, hash brown potatoes, grits, cinnamon toast, biscuits and toast. Beverages will include coffee, milk, and hot cocoa. Breakfast will be served until approximately 10:30 in the morning.

The lunch menu will include two meals, a "Soup 'N Sandwich" order and a "South Of The Border" lunch that features chili, beef tacos, and refried beans. Specials available will include steak and fries in a basket, chef's salad, and eggs rancheros with French

fries. A complete selection of sandwiches are also available, ranging from peanut butter to the Terlinguaburger, a delicious concoction of hamburger, refried beans, and cheese on a bun. Side orders include soup, chili, and French fries. There is also a selection of desserts and beverages. Items from the lunch menu may be ordered throughout the day.

The dinner menu will feature complete meals with a choice of

five entrees: T-bone steak, club steak, fried chicken, hamburger steak, and chicken fried steak. These meals include baked or French fried potatoes, salad, and beverage. Soups, chili, and sandwiches are also available on the dinner menu, as well as desserts and drinks. Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, a buffet will be served, with the barbecue buffet being featured each Saturday evening.

Erwin Named New Recreational Director

Don Baber, a student at Sul Ross State University, in Alpine, has been hired as summer activity director with the recreation program at Terlingua Ranch. A native of Ranger, he lives in Cleburne, where he graduated from high school.

Cars Now Rented In Terlingua Area

Terlingua Ranch property owners now have a car rental service available when they arrive at the Ranch. This will be of particular interest to property owners who fly their own planes to the Ranch.

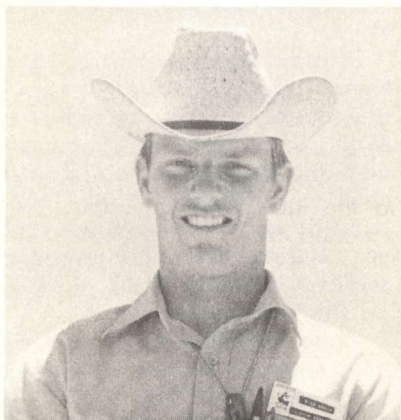
The owners of the Study Butte Cafe and Motel have initiated the car rental service. At the present time, they have one car available, a 1973 Dodge, but more will be added as needed. Four-wheel drive vehicles will also be available in the future.

The cars will rent for \$16 a day and 16 cents a mile, including gas. It is suggested that Terlingua property owners who wish to reserve a vehicle call well in advance. The car will be delivered to the Ranch and be waiting for you when you arrive. To reserve a car, call (915) 364-2447.

Weekly Discounts On Cabins Announced

A new weekly rate for rental of cabins at Terlingua Ranch goes into effect June 1. The new rate will allow property owners to receive a reduced rental rate on cabins at Terlingua Ranch went more days at any one time.

The daily rates are \$12 for one or two persons, \$14 for three persons, and \$16 for four persons. The new weekly rates, a 25 percent discount, are \$9 for one or two persons, \$10.50 for three, and \$12 for four persons.

TERLINGUA SCENE

Effective June 13, Terlingua Ranch has been forced to cancel the bus tours planned as part of the summer recreation program. This cancellation was necessitated by the fact that gasoline for the Ranch has been rationed by the supplier, and enough gas for the bus tours will not be available. In announcing the cancellation

of the bus tours, Wallace Prince, director of recreation for Terramar Corporation, said: "We regret to have to take this action, but due to the fact that our supplier has rationed the amount of gasoline available to the Ranch, as a result of the nationwide gasoline shortage, it was necessary to cancel the bus tours."

A new feature of the summer recreation program at Terlingua Ranch has just been initiated. Overnight horseback pack trips from the Lodge area to Cub Springs are being offered on a weekly basis. The overnight trip, which costs \$4.50, includes supper and breakfast. Check with the recreation staff at the Ranch when you arrive for more information.



The effort to build a church at Terlingua Ranch is progressing, with a youth group from a Corpus Christi church making a project of assisting with the drive.

Roy Huling, a Terlingua property owner from Corpus Christi, is sponsor of the Royal Ambassadors boys youth group at Lindale Baptist Church. Visiting at Terlingua during the Easter weekend, he was impressed with the attempts by young people and others to gather funds for construction of the church building. He told his youth group about it, and they decided to assist the Terlingua young people in the project.

Huling's young people are in the 6-12 year old age group.

Meanwhile, back at the Ranch, the fund drive is progressing, with approximately \$2,000 collected to

date. It is estimated that something in the neighborhood of \$5,000 will be needed. It is hoped that Terlingua property owners will help by donating building materials and labor, if they can, according to Mrs. Wade Knudsen, treasurer for the fund drive.

Sunday services led by Dan Kempf continue to enjoy good attendance. On the weekend of May 13, a total of 21 persons participated in the informal worship service, held in the Lodge building because of chilly weather. During favorable weather, services are now held outdoors on the Lodge patio.
